



## Nose Sound with Lips Closed

Story – This sound is coming out of the nose, and the mouth is closed. The nose smells M&M cookies baking and says, "Mmmm."

Hand cue: Pinch your nose with the index finger and thumb to feel the vibration, or rub your tummy as if smelling something delicious.



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


Draw 2 things that begin with this sound.

## M – Nose Sound, Lips Closed


"How do we make this sound? 'Mmmm.' Yes, we put our lips together. If I put my lips together and keep them closed, though, where is that sound coming out? Let's see if we can make this sound while we pinch our noses closed. (Pinch your nose closed.) No, we can't! The sound is coming out of our noses! This is a nose sound with closed lips. You might be able to feel your nose sound turn on when you say 'Mmmm.' (Hold bridge of nose to feel the vibrations.) (Show picture.) Do you see that big nose up there in between the two pointy parts of this letter? Can you see that the lips are closed? This nose can smell M & M cookies baking and he's rubbing his tummy, saying, 'Mmmm!' Let me see you close your lips, turn your nose on, and say, 'Mmmm.'"

Hand cue: Pinch your nose with your index finger and thumb of one hand, or rub your tummy as if smelling something delicious.



Story – This sound is coming out of the nose, too, but the mouth is open and the tongue stays up in front. When his mom asked him if he did something wrong, the nose said, "N-n-n-o." Hand cue: Pinch your nose and / or shake your head back and forth as if to say "no."


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## N – Nose Sound, Lips Open

"There's another nose sound. Do you know what that is? Say, 'Nnnnn.' Let's see if we can feel our noses turn on with that sound, 'Nnnn.' (Feel the bridge of your nose.) Can we say that sound without using our noses? Let's try! (Pinch your nose closed and direct children to do the same.) We can't do it! This is a nose sound, too, but do we keep our lips closed with this sound? No, they stay open. What does your tongue do? Oh, it goes up in the front of your mouth. (Show picture.) Look at the big nose hiding in this letter. He's a very nosy character. He always wants to know what everyone else is doing, and he likes to look at everything they have. When his mother saw her notebooks all over the floor, she asked nosy N if he had made that mess with her things. He shook his head and said, 'N-n-n-no."

Hand cue: Pinch your nose and shake your head back and forth as if saying, "No."




## Nose-choking Sound

Story – The N, who is very nosy, gets in front of the little girl (G) and tries some of her drink. The little girl touches the N's nose to see where the funny sound is coming from as he gulps the drink. Hand cue: Pinch your nose with one hand, while pretending to be drinking from a cup in the other hand.
